ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

- 1. Gain admission into the University of Central Florida.
- 2. Completion of Associate of Arts (AA) degree from a Florida College System or State University System college/university, or completion of the UCF General Education Program requirements, including the Gordon Rule requirements.
- 3. Complete a declaration of major indicating Social Work Pending as the major field of study.
- 4. Obtain a minimum of 2.5 grade point average (GPA) or better on a 4.0 GPA scale.
- 5. Completion of the BSW program prerequisites (at least three) prior to admission to the major.
 - These include: biology, psychology, sociology or social problems, American national government, macro or micro economics.

Application Deadlines

Summer: April 25 Fall: August 15

Students primarily accepted during summer and fall semesters, with spring admissions limited.
