Social workers are professionals who care about people, want to assist in improving their wellbeing and want their work to make a difference through services provided to individuals, families, groups, communities and society.

According to the International Federation of Social Workers, social work is a practice-based profession and an academic discipline that promotes social change and development, social cohesion, and the empowerment and liberation of people. Principles of social justice, human rights, collective responsibility, and respect for diversities are central to social work. Social work engages people and structures to address life challenges and enhance wellbeing. (July 2014)



For sheer diversity, few occupations can match social work, which offers the broadest range of opportunities and settings. Social workers are found in public agencies, private business, hospitals, clinics, schools, nursing homes, private practices, police departments, courts, and countless other interesting workplaces. Professional social workers can serve as managers, supervisors, administrators, educators, therapists, and researchers. Many times, they are also elected political leaders and legislators, often serving in governmental positions.

Social workers included Labor Secretary Frances Perkins, who pushed for a minimum wage and Social Security; Nobel Peace Prize winner Jane Addams, who is considered the

mother of social work; Civil Rights leaders Dorothy Height and Whitney Young Jr.; and Ambassador Wendy Sherman, who helped broker the Iran Nuclear Agreement.

According to the Bureau of Labor Statistics, social work is one of the fastest-growing professions in the United States, with 110,000 more social workers expected to enter the profession in just seven years. The prediction is a 16% national growth rate for social workers from 2016-2026.

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Related Career Titles for Social Work Majors

Social Workers help individuals and families cope with mental illness, inadequate housing, and unemployment, lack of job skills, financial mismanagement, serious illness, disability, substance abuse, unwanted pregnancy, or antisocial behavior. They also work with families who have serious conflicts, including those involving child or spousal abuse.

Approximately 600,000 Social Workers work in the USA. Nearly 40 percent of those jobs are in state, country or governmental agencies, primarily in departments of human resources, social services, child welfare, mental health, housing, education, health services, and corrections. Most in the private sector are voluntary social service agencies, community and religious organizations, hospitals, nursing homes, or home health agencies.
